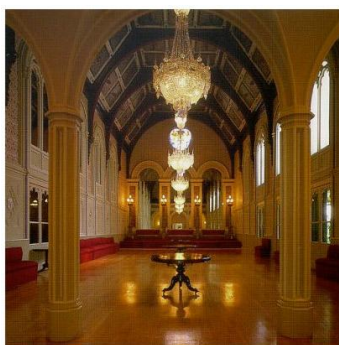

They include:

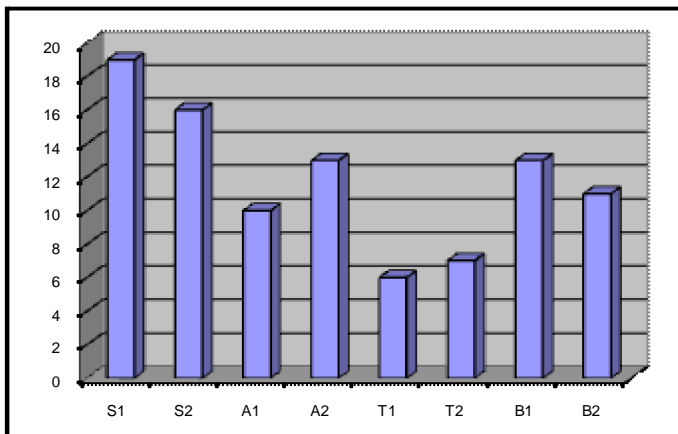
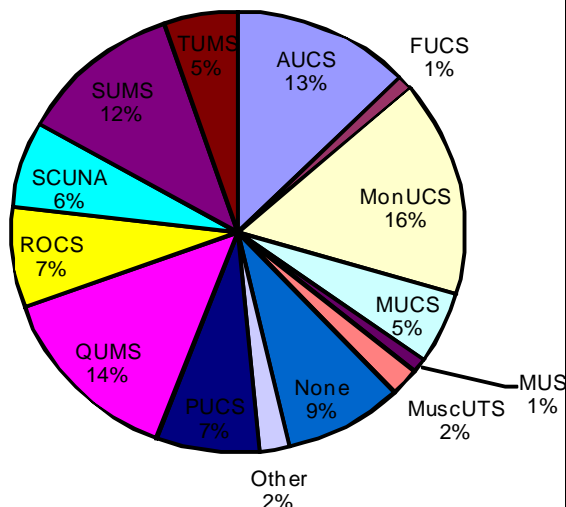
- Getting plenty of sleep,
